



WHAT TO BRING & WHAT TO READ

TO BRING:

- Bible, journal, & a pen for nightly writing
- Clothes that may be soiled by typical toddler caretaking
- Breathable fabrics, conservative in style
- Light rain jacket & rain gear
- Flip flops and beach attire (conservative when taking kids to beach), incl. a beach towel
- Snorkel/goggles/fins
- Sunscreen (may be placed in a checked bag, not allowed in carryon)
- Toiletries (liquids not allowed in carryon)
- Personal medications (must be in prescription container), bug spray, Dramamine, etc.
- Sunglasses (cheap)
- One church outfit, think conservative, but remember it will be warm
- Camera (watch it closely)
- Passport (not a suggestion!) + copy of your passport
- Identification
- Air travel itinerary
- Money and bank card (don't bring a large amount of cash) for personal spending money
- Bring enough snacks/supplies for yourself for lunches
- 1 checked bag filled with supplies provided by EO (\$15-\$25 paid by you)

Optional items that may make life more pleasant:

- Extra (empty) water bottle, to use for re-filling (optional)
- Packets of Crystal Light-type drink mix (optional)
- Laundry soap (laundry service might not be available)

- Less is best, but you want to be comfortable
